In this issue, you will find noteworthy anniversaries of several of our friars who have given decades of service to the Order, the Church, and God's people. Congratulations also to Saint Thomas of Villanova Parish in Villanova, Pennsylvania on 175 years of serving the Church. Monsignor Bonner & Archbishop Prendergast Catholic High School (where the friars spent over 50 years) celebrates their 70th anniversary this year, and Austin Preparatory School in Reading, Massachusetts (founded by the Augustinians in the 1960s) celebrates its 60th anniversary.

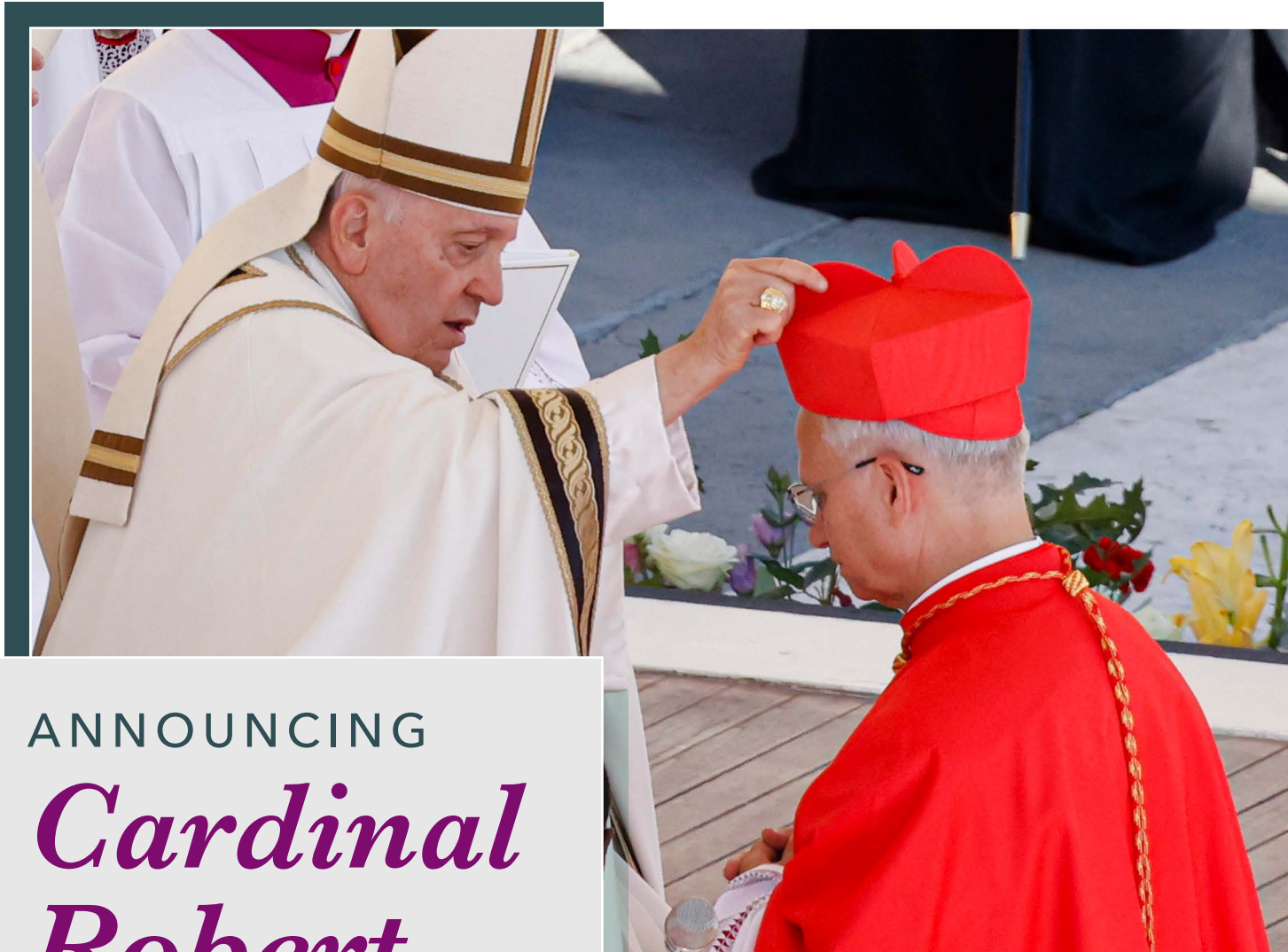

On September 30, our Augustinian brother Robert F. Prevost, O.S.A. was elevated to the rank of Cardinal. He was one of 21 new cardinals created during a ceremony at the Vatican and is the first Augustinian cardinal since His Eminence Prosper Grech, O.S.A., a Maltese Augustinian, became a cardinal in 2012.

Cardinal Prevost, O.S.A. is originally from Chicago, Illinois. An alumnus of Villanova University, he earned his Bachelor of Science degree in Mathematics in 1977. Upon graduating he entered the novitiate in the Province of Our Lady of Good Counsel in St. Louis and made his solemn vows in 1981. He studied at the Catholic Theological Union in Chicago, graduating with a degree in Theology. After studying Canon Law at the Pontifical University of Saint Thomas Aquinas in Rome, he received priestly ordination in 1982. He received his Licentiate in 1984, then was sent to work in the Augustinian mission in Chulucanas, Piura, Peru while earning his doctorate.

He served in Peru for a decade and a half before returning to the States to teach and become Prior Provincial in his native Province in the Midwest. Shortly thereafter he was elected Prior General of the worldwide Augustinian Order (a role he served for two terms) and was later appointed Bishop of the Diocese of Chiclayo, Peru.

Pope Francis appointed Cardinal Prevost the Prefect of the Dicastery for Bishops in January 2023. The Dicastery for

Bishops is the department of the Roman Curia that oversees the selection of most new bishops, and traditionally has been considered one of the Vatican's most powerful departments. Now as a cardinal, he has been appointed a member of the Dicastery for Evangelization's Section for the First Evangelization and New Particular Churches and a member of the dicasteries for the Doctrine of the Faith, for the Eastern Churches, for Clergy, for Institutes of Consecrated Life and Societies of Apostolic Life, for Culture and Education and for Legislative Texts. Pope Francis also named him to the Pontifical Commission for Vatican City State.

As to his new appointment, Cardinal Prevost recalled the words of Saint Pope Paul VI, saying that "being a cardinal is a mission of love with Christ, our Savior," and that "a cardinal is called to give his whole life in service to the Church." He also says, "I just pray to the Lord that I will be faithful in trying to fulfill what Pope Francis and the Church is now asking me."

Join us in praying for Cardinal Prevost as he assumes his important role in the Church. ✚



Our Men in FORMATION

In May, Fr. Atsushi Kuwahara, O.S.A. was ordained to the priesthood at St. Augustine Sasaoka Church in Fukuoka, Japan. Fr. Atsushi began his journey with the Augustinians as a pre-novice in Pennsylvania, studied with his Augustinian Brothers in Chicago and completed his studies in Japan. He has built many relationships across the globe. Several friars from the States (including Prior Provincial Robert P. Hagan, O.S.A., Secretary-Treasurer Fr. Aldo Potencio, O.S.A., and some of Fr. Atsushi's classmates and formators) traveled to Japan for Fr. Atsushi's ordination. Many diocesan priests who work closely with us in Japan also attended. All told there were nearly 50 priests and religious from around the world concelebrating.



In June, Br. Michael Riggs, O.S.A. was ordained to the diaconate. Bishop Dan Turley, O.S.A. presided over the ordination at Our Mother of Good Counsel in Bryn Mawr, Pennsylvania, where friars, friends, family, and parishioners gathered to celebrate with Br. Michael. He is now what we call a transitional deacon who is on his way to be ordained a priest. For a minimum of six months, Dcn. Michael will serve in Our Mother of Good Counsel Parish preaching, celebrating baptisms, weddings and ministering to God's people. He will have an opportunity to immerse himself in the sacramental life of the Church before culminating his journey with his priestly ordination.

In August, six Augustinian Novices made their First Profession of Vows at St. Clare of Montefalco Chapel in Chicago. Lou San Vicente, David Marshall, Nathan Fernandes, Frank Connor (Villanova Province), Tony Moreno, and Shon Alam will now continue their Augustinian Formation at the Chicago Theological Union with course studies in theology. They joined Br. Nicholas Stone, O.S.A. of the Villanova Province who is in simple vows, as well.

Also in August, three new novices received their white habits, including Nicholas Anderson of the Villanova Province, at Our Mother of Good Counsel Novitiate in Radnor, Pennsylvania. They will spend one year discerning more intentionally if God calls them to profess first vows as Augustinian Friars. They learn about themselves, their relationship with the Lord, and Augustinian community life more deeply. They immerse themselves in personal prayer and gain insights and skills to live as vowed members of the Order of Saint Augustine.

Eric Hollander joined the community of Blessed Stephen Bellesini Friary in Ardmore, Pennsylvania as a pre-novice in August. He will spend one year further discerning his call to the Order. ✚

CELEBRATING THE LEGACY OF SERVANT OF GOD FR. BILL ATKINSON, O.S.A.



Though paralyzed from the neck down as a young man, Servant of God Fr. Bill Atkinson, O.S.A. remained determined to follow his calling to become an Augustinian priest. Ordained the first quadriplegic priest by special papal dispensation in 1974, Fr. Bill served many years as a teacher, friar, and friend, expanding the notion of what a quadriplegic person can accomplish and inspiring those around him to look beyond their own limitations.



We began planning for this symposium with an eye to create more visibility of Fr. Bill's Cause. Our friends at Villanova University graciously hosted and co-sponsored the event with our Province. We looked for speakers who would discuss different aspects of the spirituality of disability, and we were delighted to host Dr. Brendan T. Sammon, Ph.D., associate professor at St. Joseph's University. Dr. Sammon spoke on the beauty of all God's creation during a very enlightening academic presentation. He particularly highlighted the virtue of dependence. There is incredible value to each of us and to our community when we recognize how much we need each other, and how much we need God and God's grace.

The Most Reverend Nelson J. Pérez, D.D., Archbishop of Philadelphia, shared his reflections on the value of the Communion of Saints and some of the many lessons we can learn from Fr. Bill's life. The afternoon session began with a talk by Fr. Thomas F. Dailey, O.S.F.S., Professor of Theology at St. Charles Seminary in Philadelphia, on the process of canonization of Fr. Bill Atkinson, O.S.A.

The day culminated in a panel discussion featuring four very special individuals whose lives were impacted by Fr. Bill: his sister Joan Mullen; his student and caretaker Ted Donnelly; Anne Marie Dolceamore, assistant principal of Monsignor Bonner & Archbishop Prendergast Catholic High School, who attributes a significant healing in her life to God through the intercession of Fr. Bill; and Michael Gaynor, executive director of undergraduate admissions at Villanova University, who spoke both as a friend of Fr. Bill and as a caregiver of his own disabled children who have brought joy and meaning to his life and the life of his family.

It was a joyful day in the company of friends, family, and an extended Augustinian community. This day was a day of prayer, a day of awareness, and a day in solidarity with so many others who are waiting for healing, forgiveness, and peace. And hopefully it was a day when people discovered a new friend in Fr. Bill, who can offer them inspiration and hope as they move through their daily lives. ✚

A PROFILE IN Augustinian Leadership



Almost 200 people gathered at the Overbrook Golf Club in Villanova, Pennsylvania on September 28 for a Profile in Augustinian Leadership featuring guest of honor **Randy Foye**, Villanova alumnus, former NBA player, founder of the Randy Foye Foundation and president of Friends of Nova.



Having lost both his parents by age six, Foye has seen firsthand the difficulties for kids growing up in a tough urban environment. In 2008, he established the Randy Foye Foundation (RFF) to raise funds and develop programs and projects aimed directly at improving the lives of the children in Newark, his hometown. Foye understands firsthand the difference a positive role model and nurturing environment can make in a young person's life. Through Foye's own story and contacts in the worlds of professional sports, entertainment and business, and working hand in hand with the corporations and people of Newark, the RFF serves as an example of what a grass roots movement can accomplish through special events if everyone is focused on working hard and giving back.

Randy shared how his time at Villanova University shaped his desire to give back to his community and how the Augustinian values he learned there made him the man he is today and continue to influence his life. †

“My faith was tested as a boy but has strengthened as a man. I saw God's grace in my early mentors in high school. I saw God's grace in my angel, Grandma Ruth. I saw God's grace at Villanova in the community that surrounded me. And I see God's grace every day in the eyes of my wife and my daughters. Basketball was the vessel for my blessed life, and I thank God every day for that. When you are a true believer, there's no such thing as losses; there are only lessons.”

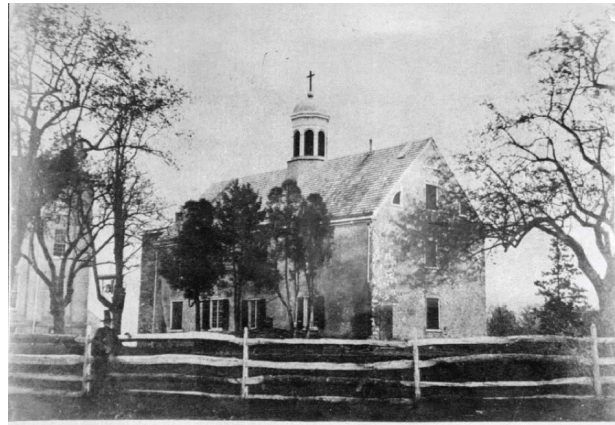

Augustinian *Anniversaries*



SAINT THOMAS OF VILLANOVA PARISH VILLANOVA, PENNSYLVANIA - 175 YEARS

On August 15, 1848, a baptism was celebrated as the first official act of the parish of Saint Thomas of Villanova, which had been established soon after the Augustinians founded Villanova University. The parish kicked off a series of celebrations in honor of the 175th anniversary of the parish on Sunday, August 13. The parish community enjoyed a liturgy where Archbishop Nelson Perez, D.D., presided and many Augustinian Friars served as concelebrants. The parish choir, recalled from their summer break for this important occasion, did a wonderful job leading the congregation in song. About 350 people enjoyed brunch after the service at the Connelly Center of Villanova University.



The second celebratory event, a ministry fair, followed on September 17, with the final celebration on October 8. The parish rented out the nearby Inn at Villanova for four hours of family fun: face painting and balloon animals for the young (and young at heart), outdoor games, and a silent auction to benefit the parish. A whole section of the Inn was set aside as the Eagles Nest—a place for all the Philadelphia Eagles fans (including former pastor Fr. Rich O'Leary, O.S.A.) to gather, eat nachos and pretzels, cheer on the Birds, and sing the fight song under the enthusiastic direction of the parish's choir director.



MONSIGNOR BONNER & ARCHBISHOP PRENDERGAST CATHOLIC HIGH SCHOOL DREXEL HILL, PENNSYLVANIA - 70 YEARS

Seventy years ago on September 9, 1953, Archbishop Prendergast High School for Boys welcomed its first students. From that day until June 2009, the Augustinian Friars of the Province of Saint Thomas of Villanova provided inspiration (and the mascot) for what is now Monsignor Bonner & Archbishop Prendergast Catholic High School. During those 56 years, more than 150 Augustinian Friars served as administrators, teachers, counselors, chaplains, moderators of activities and athletic teams, and friends and confidants to numerous students, faculty, and staff at the school. Additionally, a great many Augustinian vocations were nurtured and realized at Bonner. In one way or



another, the friars touched the lives of the more than 20,000 graduates during that period. Bonner & Prendie kicked off a year of celebratory events with a field day on September 9, featuring food trucks, a photo booth and—most importantly—a celebration of Mass where Fr. Joe Mostardi, O.S.A. presided and several friars concelebrated.



AUSTIN PREPARATORY SCHOOL READING, MASSACHUSETTS - 60 YEARS

Sixty years ago, when the first students stepped through the door of Austin Preparatory School, the Augustinian Friars were there to greet them. For 24 years, the friars taught the young men of Austin Prep, shaping not only their education but their spiritual lives, creating learned, well-rounded men of heart. Even though the school is no longer sponsored by the Augustinians, Saint Augustine remains the school's patron saint, and to this day the community strives toward the Augustinian ideal of "one mind, one heart, intent on God." A Mass on the field and gala were held on September 15 to commemorate this special milestone in the school's history.

FR. JOHN JOSEPH SHERIDAN, O.S.A.

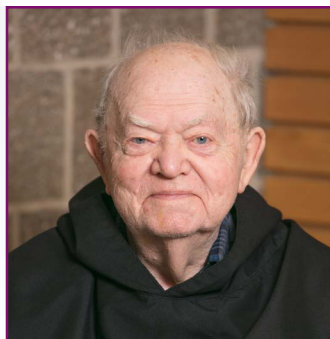
Born: April 16, 1929

 Ordained: May 4, 1985
 Died: February 9, 2023



As Archivist of the Province, Fr. John oversaw the move of the archives from the Provincial Offices to a larger, state-of-the-art archives facility, consisting of a large vault and work room located in Saint Thomas of Villanova Monastery. He also orchestrated the copying of Province documents onto DVDs so that the documents could be electronically accessed and not physically handled, assuring their preservation.

FR. JOHN JOSEPH FERRENCE, O.S.A.

Born: May 8, 1926
 First Profession: September 10, 1945
 Ordained: June 9, 1952
 Died: February 26, 2023



Fr. Ferrence spent 38 years teaching chemistry at Msgr. Bonner High School, and though he retired from teaching in 2002 he continued to reside in the friary, helping out in the school when needed and remaining connected with many of his former students and their families. He officiated at the weddings of many of these former students and said that his success in teaching was credited to his "way of making sure that the students are treated as young adults".

FR. MICHAEL PATRICK SULLIVAN, O.S.A.

Born: March 11, 1940
 First Profession: September 10, 1960
 Ordained: September 9, 1967
 Died: August 3, 2023



Fr. Michael spent much of his life as a preaching apostolate, traveling around the United States (as well as Australia and South Africa) giving retreats to parishes and other groups. He was profoundly grateful for good friends and for a wonderfully rewarding life as a preacher of the Gospel. He was grateful for the opportunity to help fellow travelers along the road with Jesus, the compassionate Savior, and to illuminate the way for others and serve others in their search for God.

FR. EDWARD JOHN DIXEY, O.S.A.

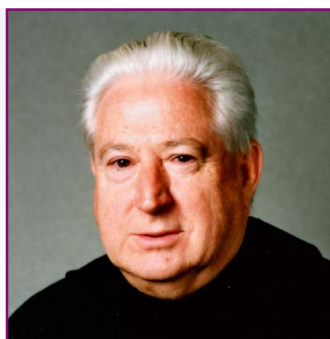
Born: May 31, 1929

Fr. Ed spent much of his life teaching at Msgr. Bonner High School and in parish ministry, in addition to serving as sub-master of professed and Master of Professed at the Augustinian Collegiate Seminary, Villanova University. Fr. Ed faced the decline in his physical mobility the way he faced everything in life, with a peaceful and prayerful demeanor.

FR. WILLIAM HOWARD MCGRAW, O.S.A.

A Korean War veteran of the United States Army, Fr. Howie began the Marian Healing Ministry, which he ran for 24 years. For those who knew him well, Fr. Howie was known for being jovial, kind-hearted and spiritual. He demonstrated a grateful spirit, especially for the people who cared for him at the monastery.

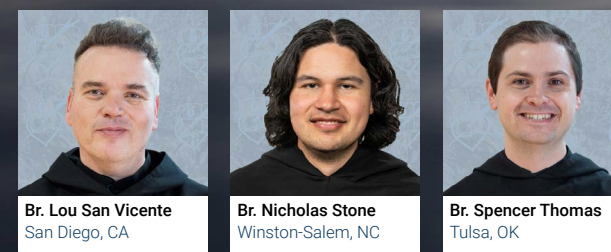
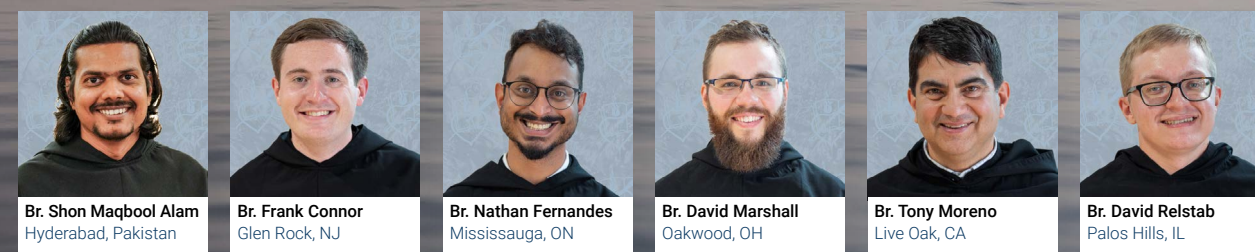

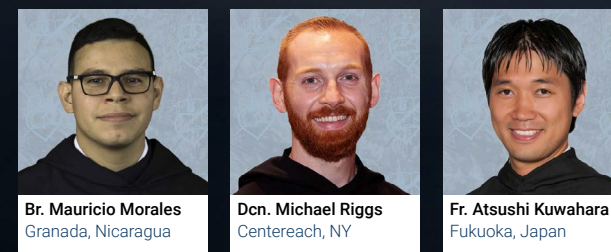
